

WHO'S WHO IN ANTI-DOPING!



TOP TEN – Who's who in Anti-Doping!

1. **WADA** — the World Anti-Doping Agency is responsible for promoting, coordinating and monitoring the fight against doping in sport in all its forms, across the world. WADA is based in Canada, with regional offices in most continents.
2. **NADOs** — a National Anti-Doping Organisation is the lead anti-doping agency for an individual country.
3. **UK Anti-Doping** — the UK NADO, based in London and responsible for Clean Sport, protecting the rights of athletes to compete in doping-free sport.
4. **IOC** — International Olympic Committee, responsible for the Olympic movement and setting the anti-doping rules for each Olympic Games.
5. **LOCOG** — London Organising Committee of the Olympic Games and Paralympic Games is the body responsible for organising and running the London 2012 Olympic Games. LOCOG are responsible for the anti-doping testing programme at the Games.
6. **IFs** — International Federations are the international governance bodies responsible for specific sports, such as FIFA, IAAF, ICU. IF's role in anti-doping is to comply with the Code, and set sport specific anti-doping rules, as an example.

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7. **NGBs** — National Governing Bodies of sport, governing agencies for specific sports in the UK such as FA, ECB, and British Gymnastics. The NGBs have a responsibility to comply with the UK anti-doping policy and support athletes and core personnel to adhere to the anti-doping rules.
8. **DCMS** — Department of Culture, Media and Sport. Government department whose remit is to ensure the UK meets the requirements of the UNESCO anti-doping convention signed up to by the UK government and many international governments worldwide. UK Anti-Doping is given the responsibility and funding by DCMS to manage anti-doping in the UK as a non-departmental government body.
9. **NADP** — National Anti-Doping Panel is the independent group that hears all doping cases in the UK. The NADP is independent to ensure athletes are given a fair hearing, with UK Anti-Doping acting as the prosecutor in such hearings.
10. **DCP & ASP** — Doping Control Personnel is the collective term for all roles associated with the doping control, including Chaperones, DCOs and Lead DCOs. Athlete Support Personnel is the collective term used to describe all support roles that work with athletes — including coach, nutritionist, sports medic, psychologist, performance lifestyle.
